THE CONGREGATION AT PRAYER

A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer The week of the Transfiguration of Our Lord January 29-February 4, 2022

Catechetical Notes for the week: The third part of Baptism teaches us that the power and efficacy of Baptism lies in the Word of God and not in the water. The water is plain water until it is connected to the Word of God. Only then does it become a powerful Bath of regeneration and renewal by the Spirit. The Spirit works in this washing to create faith. He drowns all that is evil and raises us with Christ. He brings the blessings of Christ's cross to us. He makes us holy through this Bath. The third part of Baptism shows us that we are dead in sin, unable to save ourselves, lost and condemned without the work of the Spirit in these waters. We cannot help Him. We cannot assist Him. He must do all the work in us if we are to be saved. It leads us to repentance and faith in the Spirit who through Baptism has given us the new life Christ has won for us.

Theme: The fullness of God hidden in a cross.

BIBLE VERSE: 1 Peter 3:18 For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. He was put to death in the body but made alive by the Spirit.

How can water do such great things? Certainly not just water, but the Word of God in and with the water does these things, along with the faith which trusts this Word of God in the water. For without God's Word the water is plain water and no Baptism. But with the Word of God it is a Baptism, that is, a life-giving water, rich in grace, and a washing of the new birth in the Holy Spirit, as St. Paul says in Titus, chapter three:	3rd Grade+

PRAYER

Pray the Catechism: (The catechetical notes are meant to assist you in this.)

Example:

Repeat the third part of Baptism

A teaching: <u>Dear Father, in the</u> third part of Baptism <u>You teach me</u> that Your Word unites with water to

give me a new birth in the Holy Spirit.

A thanksgiving: I thank You for drawing me out of these waters and giving me an eternal home with You.

A confession: I confess and ask for grace that I have devalued this Bath and exalted myself, my works, my

decisions to its equal.

A prayer: <u>I ask You</u> to remain faithful to the promise You made me at Baptism. Forgive me. And bring

me to life everlasting.

Personal prayers: (suggestions listed below)

Sunday: *Pray for the joy of the resurrection among us; for true and godly worship throughout the*

world; and for the faithful preaching and hearing of God's Word.

Monday: Pray for faith to live in the promises of Holy Baptism; for your calling and daily work; for

the unemployed; for the salvation and well-being of our neighbors; for government; and for

peace.

Tuesday: Pray for deliverance against temptation; for the addicted and despairing; for the tortured

and oppressed; and for those struggling with besetting sins.

Wednesday: Pray for marriage and family, that all may live together under the grace of Christ according

to the Word of God; for parents who must rear their children alone; and for godly schools,

our church schools, and seminaries.

Thursday: Pray for the Church and her pastors; for missionaries; and for fruitful and salutary use of

the blessed Sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood.

Friday: Pray for the preaching of the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ and for its spread throughout

the whole world, especially in our community; and for the persecuted.

Saturday: *Pray for faithfulness to the end; for the sick and dying; for the revival of those who are*

withering in the faith or have fallen away; and for receptive hearts for worship and study on

the Lord's Day.

Prayer for the Transfiguration of Our Lord

O God, who in the glorious Transfiguration of Your only-begotten Son has confirmed the mystery of the faith by the testimony of the fathers, and who in the voice that came from the bright cloud wonderfully foreshadowed the adoption of sons: mercifully make us co-heirs with the King in His glory; and bring us to the fullness of our inheritance in heaven, through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord, who lives and reigns with You, and the Holy Spirit; one God, now and forever.

Luther's Morning/Evening Prayer

Morning: I thank You, my heavenly Father, though Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have kept me this night from all harm and danger; and I pray that You would keep me this day also from sin and every evil, that all my doings and life may please You. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.

Evening: I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have graciously kept me this day; and I pray that You would forgive me all my sins where I have done wrong, and graciously keep me this night. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.
