THE CONGREGATION AT PRAYER

A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer The week of the Third Last Sunday of the Church Year November 12-18, 2023

Catechetical Notes for the week: The <u>second article</u> teaches us that the second Person of the Trinity is the Son of God, Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. He is one with the Father and one with us. He is begotten from the Father from eternity and born from the Virgin in time—so He has a divine nature and a human nature. Everything that He did from His conception forward, He did and continues to do as true God and as true man. After His conception His divine nature and human nature can never be separated; never do they act independently of each other for He is One Person even today in glory. So we are certain of our salvation because the Son of God took our sins, guilt, punishment and died our death and today gives us His life. The second article shows us that we need to be saved. We were helplessly lost without Jesus. We needed God to die for us, so great were our sins, so great was His love. Nothing but the death of the Son of God in human flesh could save us. Yet by brushing off our sins as unimportant, we have despised the death of Christ. We have viewed Christmas with indifference almost as our right instead of marveling at the love of our God who descended to live with us. It calls us to repentance and faith in Jesus, God's Son, Mary's Son, who saved us by His blood and even today remains our brother and our God so we can be certain of our salvation in Him.

Theme: The Urgency and Suddenness of Christ's Return.

PRAYER

Pray the Catechism: (The catechetical notes are meant to assist you in this.)

Example:

Repeat the 2nd Article

- A teaching: <u>Dear Father, in the</u> second article <u>You teach me</u> that Jesus is true God and true man born from the Blessed Virgin Mary. He has done all things and continues to do all things as both God and man so that He is my Savior.
- A thanksgiving: <u>I thank You</u> for sending Your Son to take on my flesh as His own. He is my eternal Brother and God giving me His blessings through that same crucified and risen flesh.
- A confession: <u>I confess and ask for grace</u> that I have viewed Christmas with nostalgia instead of a holy mystery, and a past event instead of a present reality. My reason has left the body of Christ in heaven while His divinity remains everywhere.
- *A prayer:* <u>*I ask You for help in pondering this holy mystery of the incarnation. Deepen my faith and joy in the Person of Jesus. And lead me to crave His divine flesh and blood in the Holy Supper my salvation. Amen.*</u>

Personal prayers: (suggestions listed below)

Sunday:	Pray for the joy of the resurrection among us; for true and godly worship throughout the
	world; and for the faithful preaching and hearing of God's Word.
Monday:	Pray for faith to live in the promises of Holy Baptism; for your calling and daily work; for
	the unemployed; for the salvation and well-being of our neighbors; for government; and for
	peace.
Tuesday:	Pray for deliverance against temptation; for the addicted and despairing; for the tortured
	and oppressed; and for those struggling with besetting sins.
Wednesday:	Pray for marriage and family, that all may live together under the grace of Christ according
	to the Word of God; for parents who must rear their children alone; and for godly schools,
	our church schools, and seminaries.
Thursday:	Pray for the Church and her pastors; for missionaries; and for fruitful and salutary use of
	the blessed Sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood.

Friday: Pray for the preaching of the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ and for its spread throughout the whole world, especially in our community; and for the persecuted.

Saturday: Pray for faithfulness to the end; for the sick and dying; for the revival of those who are withering in the faith or have fallen away; and for receptive hearts for worship and study on the Lord's Day.

Prayer for the Third Last Sunday of the Church Year

Almighty God, we beseech You: show Your mercy to Your humble servants; that we who put no trust in our own merits may not be dealt with after the severity of Your judgment, but according to Your mercy, through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord; who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit: one God, now and forever.

For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.
