THE CONGREGATION AT PRAYER

A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer The week of the Second Last Sunday of the Church Year November 19-25, 2023

Catechetical Notes for the week: The <u>second article</u> teaches us that the second Person of the Trinity is the Son of God, Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. He was born to be our Substitute and so our Sacrifice, to pay for our sins, appease the wrath of God, and so die our death on the cross. Only Jesus could do all this. He had to be true man to have blood; He had to be true God to give that blood infinite value or else we could not be saved. His resurrection confirmed His all-atoning death and showed Him to be the Son of God. Even now ascended in heaven He rules all things as our Brother so we may be certain we will follow Him to heaven with our bodies. The second article shows us that we need to be saved. We need God to die for us, so great were our sins, so great was His love. Yet we have despised the work of Christ by taking it for granted and have wanted to hear about something different. We have failed to see how His death and resurrection is God's solution to all problems in our life. We have looked past His death and resurrection wanting something more. It calls us to repentance and faith in the God who died and rose to save us and now rules all things for our eternal good.

Theme: Christ returns to Judge.

PRAYER

Pray the Catechism: (The catechetical notes are meant to assist you in this.)

Example:

Repeat the 2nd Article

A teaching: <u>Dear Father, in the</u> Second Article <u>You teach me</u> that Jesus is true God and true man born from the Blessed Virgin Mary. He alone has won my salvation by His bitter sufferings and death.

A thanksgiving: <u>I thank You</u> for sending Your Son to take on my flesh as His own. Without Him I would be separated from You for all eternity; but through Him you have made me Your beloved son.

A confession: <u>I confess and ask for grace</u> that I have taken for granted that marvelous death and resurrection. I have wanted to hear sermons about myself rather than Your boundless love.
A prayer: <u>I ask You</u> for help in meditating on His death and resurrection. Lead me to always treasure that cross as the source of my salvation. Continually give me the blessings of that cross so that through it and it alone I might have salvation. Amen.

Personal prayers: (suggestions listed below)

Sunday:	<i>Pray for the joy of the resurrection among us; for true and godly worship throughout the world; and for the faithful preaching and hearing of God's Word.</i>
Monday:	Pray for faith to live in the promises of Holy Baptism; for your calling and daily work; for the unemployed; for the salvation and well-being of our neighbors; for government; and for peace.
Tuesday:	<i>Pray for deliverance against temptation; for the addicted and despairing; for the tortured and oppressed; and for those struggling with besetting sins.</i>
Wednesday:	Pray for marriage and family, that all may live together under the grace of Christ according to the Word of God; for parents who must rear their children alone; and for godly schools, our church schools, and seminaries.
Thursday:	Pray for the Church and her pastors; for missionaries; and for fruitful and salutary use of the blessed Sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood.
Friday:	Pray for the preaching of the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ and for its spread throughout the whole world, especially in our community; and for the persecuted.
Saturday:	Pray for faithfulness to the end; for the sick and dying; for the revival of those who are withering in the faith or have fallen away; and for receptive hearts for worship and study on the Lord's Day.

Prayer for the Second Last Sunday of the Church Year

Absolve, we beseech You, O Lord, Your people from their offenses: that from the bonds of our sins which by reason of our frailty we have brought upon us; we may be delivered by Your bountiful goodness, through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord; who lives and reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit: one God, now and forever.

Luther's Morning/Evening Prayer

Morning: I thank You, my heavenly Father, though Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have kept me this night from all harm and danger; and I pray that You would keep me this day also from sin and every evil, that all my doings and life may please You. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.

Evening: I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have graciously kept me this day; and I pray that You would forgive me all my sins where I have done wrong, and graciously keep me this night. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.
