THE CONGREGATION AT PRAYER

A Guide for Daily Meditation and Prayer The Second week of the Transfiguration January 21-27, 2024

Catechetical Notes for the week: The seventh petition teaches us to trust in God in times of trouble. We go through many hardships. They burden our body, mind, soul, and heart. God never leaves us, but He gentle guides us, watches us, protects us in His way and time. Finally, He rescues us by bringing us out of this world and to heaven. So the answer to our various hardships is God's forgiveness won on the cross and given in Word and Sacraments. Every hardship will soon pass like a fleeting shadow. The seventh petition shows us that we have failed to trust in God to deliver. We've doubted His protection, questioned His love, and complained as we struggle. We've acted as if He were unfair to us and have forgotten His abiding love in Christ. We've wanted rescuing in our way and time rather than by His forgiveness. It calls us to repentance and faith in the God who has delivered us by Christ's cross and given it to us through Word and Sacraments. The conclusion teaches us that God always hears our prayers. He is our loving Father. He tenderly listens to every word we utter. He's ready to help. He's willing to help. He will do what is best for us. "Yes, yes, it shall be so." God's will will be done. It's the voice of confidence. God has heard. He will answer. The conclusion shows us that we have doubted God's eagerness to hear our prayer. We have thought our prayers, problems, and life are too impossible or too insignificant and God has more important things to worry about. So we have neglected our prayers or prayed halfheartedly. It calls us to repentance and faith in the God who desires to give us far more than we can possibly ask or imagine through His beloved Son.

Theme: The fulness of God dwells in Christ's flesh to win salvation by His cross.

We pray in this petition, in summary, that our Father in heaven would rescue us from every evil of body and soul, possessions and person, and finally, when our last hour comes, give us a blessed end, and graciously take us from this valley of sorrow to Himself in heaven.	2nd Grade+
<i>What is the conclusion?</i> For Thine is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. Amen.	Preschool+

What does this mean?	3rd grade+
This means that I should be certain that these petitions are pleasing to our Father in heaven, and	
are heard by Him; for He Himself has commanded us to pray in this way and has promised to	
hear us. Amen, amen means "yes, yes, it shall be so."

PRAYER

Pray the Catechism: (The catechetical notes are meant to assist you in this.)

Example:

Repeat the seventh petition and conclusion

- A teaching: <u>Dear Father, in the</u> seventh petition <u>You teach me</u> that You will deliver me from all evil by Christ's cross and given it to me in Word and Sacraments. I will see this when You bring me to heaven.
- A thanksgiving: <u>I thank You</u> for delivering me from Satan, sin, and every difficulty by Christ in Word and Sacraments.
- *A* confession: <u>I confess and ask for grace</u> that I have doubted Your deliverance, been impatient, and have desired something besides Your deliverance in Christ.
- *A prayer:* <u>*I ask You*</u> to rescue me through Your Son, my Savior. Do not take Him from me.

Personal prayers: (suggestions listed below)

Sunday:	Pray for the joy of the resurrection among us; for true and godly worship throughout the
	world; and for the faithful preaching and hearing of God's Word.
Monday:	Pray for faith to live in the promises of Holy Baptism; for your calling and daily work; for
	the unemployed; for the salvation and well-being of our neighbors; for government; and for
	peace.
Tuesday:	<i>Pray for deliverance against temptation; for the addicted and despairing; for the tortured and oppressed; and for those struggling with besetting sins.</i>
Wednesday:	Pray for marriage and family, that all may live together under the grace of Christ according
	to the Word of God; for parents who must rear their children alone; and for godly schools,
	our church schools, and seminaries.
Thursday:	Pray for the Church and her pastors; for missionaries; and for fruitful and salutary use of
	the blessed Sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood.
Friday:	Pray for the preaching of the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ and for its spread throughout
	the whole world, especially in our community; and for the persecuted.

Saturday:

Pray for faithfulness to the end; for the sick and dying; for the revival of those who are withering in the faith or have fallen away; and for receptive hearts for worship and study on the Lord's Day.

Prayer for the Transfiguration of Our Lord

O God, who in the glorious Transfiguration of Your only-begotten Son has confirmed the mystery of the faith by the testimony of the fathers, and who in the voice that came from the bright cloud wonderfully foreshadowed the adoption of sons: mercifully make us co-heirs with the King in His glory; and bring us to the fullness of our inheritance in heaven, through the same Jesus Christ, Your Son, Our Lord; who lives and reigns with You, in the unity of the Holy Spirit: one God, now and forever. Amen.

Luther's Morning/Evening Prayer

Morning: I thank You, my heavenly Father, though Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have kept me this night from all harm and danger; and I pray that You would keep me this day also from sin and every evil, that all my doings and life may please You. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.

Evening: I thank You, my heavenly Father, through Jesus Christ, Your dear Son, that You have graciously kept me this day; and I pray that You would forgive me all my sins where I have done wrong, and graciously keep me this night. For into Your hands I commend myself, my body and soul, and all things. Let Your holy angel be with me, that the evil foe may have no power over me. Amen.
